with respect to hunger, poverty, agriculture and trade.

SANSAD makes all efforts to involve the rural communities in all advocacy efforts. SANSAD is

continuously developing strategies to defend the livelihood of South Asia's poor and hungry.

SANSAD is developing a resource centre that will function as nodal agency for research,

documentation, collection, analysis and dissemination of information and reference materials.

1. Overall Progress:

Since April 2015 Japan Fund for Global Environment (JFGE) which was supporting SANSAD got over.

RKK also like last year generously agreed to provide financial support to SANSAD to meet the budgetary gaps in the overall project proposal also got over after continuously supporting for four years.

A) Activities conducted in FY 2018-19

1 Training of Trainers:



On February 20-21,2018, SANSAD organized a two days Training of Trainers (ToT) programme in Hotel Sky Lark, Saharanpur in which around 40 local people drawn from farmers communities, agricultural scientists, NGO leaders were trained by experts came from all over the Country so that these trained local people can act as Master trainers for training of local farmers.

2. Training of 200 farmers:





Since April 2015 formal training of farmers started in phase manner and so far SANSAD has organised 36 days of training of farmers in five locations- Chalakpur village, Patni village, Ahardi village, Alhanpur village and Firozabad village. Apart from that field level practical training was also conducted to expose farmers how to plant paddy crop through SRI methods in June 2018, wheat plantation as mixed cropping methods in November 2018 and vegetable plantation in the month of September and October 2018.

3. Training and exposure of effective use of Animals and its product:

During training courses, special session was also organized to educate and sensitize effective use of animals and its product.

It has been noticed that farmers are virtually cheated by local middle man and therefore they are not getting proper returns to their product. SANSAD encouraged farmers to form their cooperative and sale milk in collective manner so that they can get proper remunerations. Farmers are also trained how to make organic manures and pesticides at their house hold level to reduce input cost of agriculture and make land healthy with increasing use of organic manure and decreasing use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides. People were encouraged to rear local breed of cow and use cow dung and urine for increasing farm productivity.

4. Farmers Convention-1: In this financial year SANSAD organized one farmers

conventions:



South Asian Network for Social & Agricultural Development (SANSAD) in collaboration with Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Sultanpur Chilkana Nagar Panchayat and more than 20 Gram Panchayats, organized a big Farmers Convention on September 20th 2018 at Jain Bagh, Chilkana, Saharanpur in which around 600 farmers and many eminent personalities participated and addressed the gathering.



Those Gram Panchayats collaborated with SANSAD in organizing this farmers convention are AbdullahpurAhardi, Alhanpur, Chalakpur, Daulatpur, Dhaulahedi, Dudhgarh, Dumjheda, Dumjhedi, Firozabad, Katla, Manakpur, NarayanpurGurjar, Nalheda, Pathed, Patna, Patni, Raghunathpur, RawanpurBujurg, Sangmaur and Todarpur. It was pertaining to note that first time in the history of Chilkana, Saharanpur that such a convention was organized jointly by many public institutions and elected local self- governments.

Dr. Kamal Taori, IAS and retired Secretary Government of India; Former Minister of State Shri Sanjay

Garg; National Convener, Education Forum, New Delhi Shri AmbrishRai; Director of PANI Sansthan, Shri Bharat Bhushan; Dr. Ashok Kumar of Krshi Vigyan Kendra and Shri Yogendra Singh, Krishi Adhikari, Saharanpur participated as Guest speakers. Farmers Convention was chaired by Advocate Amir Zaidi as a representative of Chairman of Sultanpur Chilkana Nagar Panchayat Smt. Suraiya Jama and Senior Journalist Shri Vijay Saini anchored the show.

Anil K Singh in his opening remarks highlighted why his organization selected Saharanpur district to implements this project which is sponsored by two Japanese organization called Japan Fund for Global Environment (JFGE) and RKK. Technical support provided by another Japanese organization called ShaplaNeer. He highlighted that what kind of hurdles they have faced initially but thanks the local communities who have helped a lot in initiating this project in this area. He highlighted that farmer's suicides in the country has forced him and some of his friends who give- up their lucrative jobs and set up SANSAD as an organization to focus mainly on Farmers issues.

Dr. Kamal Taori stressed the important of Cow rearing and promotion of organic farming. He also proposed to set up many agricultural based small scale industries and make Chilkana as "Chilkanaway" the way Americans have developed to provide employment to local people and generate additional income for them. He also stressed the need of linking village level "FARMERS SCHOOLS" promoted by SANSAD with Banks and NABARD.

Shri Sanjay Garg, former Minister of State, UP was of the opinion that organic farming must be adopted as a movement to counter multi- national companies who are trying to grab our agricultural land make us food insecure country and then dictate terms. He said that present national government policies are same of previous government and both have worked and working to help corporates such as Ambanis and Adanies.

Shri AmbrishRai called upon farmers to unite and expose ill design of bib multi-national companies and challenge anti farmers policies of the Government. Organic farming could be one tool to expose ill design of multi-national companies the way Mahatma Gandhi exposed Britishers with boycotting of foreign clothes.

Shri Bharat Bhushan said that his organization is promoting organic farming in their area and results are very positive and farmers are adopting in a big way as they have understood the benefits or

organic farming which requires less input cost and gives healthy food. He also called upon farmers to

make Saharanpur as Chemical free district with adoption of organic farming. He also pointed out that Prime Minister himself believes in organic farming therefore interested in promotion of organic

farming in North Eastern states on India.

Dr. Ashok Kumar of Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Saharanpur and Shri Narender Singh Bhullar of village

Paniyali who are participating in Farmers training organized by SANSAD for the last one and half years

has said that there is a need to systematically organized and motivate farmers of ill effect of chemical fertilizers and pesticides as our lands are becoming less fertile day by day. We have given training to farmers on how to make organic fertilizers and pesticides with local materials used in our house hold level. Dr. Ashok Kumar highlighted role of Krishi Vigyan Kendra in promotion of farming with less input cost. SANSAD efforts are commendable in this regards.

Shri Yogendra Singh, Krishi Adhikari, Saharanpur stressed the need of adopting vermi compost (Ketua Khad) against heavy use of chemical fertilizer. He offered to help and trained farmers in making pit for making vermy compost free of cost.

Chairperson of the meeting, Advocate Amir Zaidi thanked SANSAD for choosing this area and deciding to empower local farmers through capacity building and sensitizing them for promotion of organic farming which is going to be the future of agriculture.

Many Pradhans of different Gram Panchayats also spoke and appreciated efforts of SANSAD.

5. Effectiveness of Bio gas plant:

SANSAD organized several exposure trip of farmers on its farmland to show how effective is bio gas plant. With just one bio gas plant one family can get 1200 kg of organic fertilizer in a month, can lit 2-4 lamps and cook food for 6-7 members three times a day without incurring any additional cost. For running one bio gas plant only two buffalos or three Cows are needed.

6. Awareness building of farming communities:

SANSAD organized wall writings of different slogans prepared by the master trainers in the selected 20 villages of the localities. So far we have organized painting of more than 240 slogans in the localities which created a very good environment about organic farming. Almost every day we are getting number of calls from farmers. A ripple effect one can see because of that.

SANSAD also organized three rallies of farmers in the month of February 2018 in which a large

number of Children participated. People were carrying hundreds of colorful banners on which slogans in support of organic farming was written and slogan shouting was part of the rally. SANSAD also prepared 2 leaflets of 1000 each and after printing it distributed widely to the trainees as well as to other farmers.

SANSAD also organized YOGA Diwas on June 21st 2018 as per call given by United Nations to educate people at large and mold them into living a simple and sustainable life style. On August 15th which is our Independence day, SANSAD organized plantation of plant day involving a large number of students and aware them about environment degradation as well importance of plants in our life.

7. Exposure visit of farmers:



Selected 16 farmers from the operational villages was sent to Punjab for 4 days (From March 1st to 4th 2019) exposure visit. They went to different locations where good organic farming as model has emerged and with the help of a local NGO get exposures. It was really a very exciting and learning experience for all those who were part of the team.

8. Village level rally for awareness generation:



SANSAD organized several rallies in different villages to build awareness amongst farmers in which large number of children from schools participated along with their parents. Initially we noticed that farmers were hesitant to participate but after seeing their children's in these rallies they gradually started participating.

9. Farmers School:

SANSAD is trying to form Farmers Schools in these above mentioned villages and liked with more than 26 existing Farmers clubs in the old villages selected last year and provide additional literatures, films, books and booklets so that these farmers club can work as learning centre for farmers and become a real farmers schools. In 2015-16 SANSAD is trying to form 20 new Farmers Schools in the newly selected villages.

10. SANSAD local office:

SANSAD local office at Chilkana is functioning well with all modern communication facilities as well as like a call centre for farmers as they are calling us to know remedies of their various problems related with farming, animal husbandry as well as other local social problems such as alcoholism, domestic violence, indebtness etc.

11. SANSAD Website:

SANSAD Website was upgraded this year and one can see how many hits are there. It is a healthy sign that since inception of project in Saharanpur in September 2013, till date we are having more than 1,23,789 hits.

Survey/ information dissemination/awareness raising (bench mark survey, review of reports/references, posters & leaflets dissemination, farmers convention):

a) For awareness raising SANSAD has organized wall writing of slogans in 20 villages and

overall more than 240 slogans has painted on walls of these 20 selected villages.

b) Many books/reports were reviewed to suit of training of farmers and used while training.

c) SANSAD prepared and printed two leaflets on importance of organic farming and

disseminated to all trainees as well as to large number of farmers of the area.

d) SANSAD also printed 1000 copy of a appeal letter addressed to the farmers and appeal

to adopt organic farming which was distributed widely.

e) SANSAD organised a big FARMERS CONVENTION on September 20th 2018 in collaboration with local Municipality, number of Local Self Governments(Panchayats), number of NGOs and Agricultural College situated in the area. A large number of farmers, academicians, Agricultural Scientist, Media fellows and thousands of local farmers are going to participate in it.

SANSAD has used various trainers of the ToT as Master trainers and various training manuals prepared by others also for imparting training to the farmers. Literatures/ books/ booklets/folders/video films collected are used by Farmers Schools to aware others farmers of their respective villages which has impacted their mind set and now they are ready to go for such training organised by SANSAD in future.

f)Networking: During a short span of time SANSAD has build a very good rapport with many local NGOs, Panchayats(Local Self Government), local Municipality and many eminent people of the area.

Unavoidable Problem faced while implementing project: In this year also communal violence took

place in Saharanpur and due to that our movement was restricted and therefore no activity took place during that time It is unfortunate that sometimes political parties create such tension to gain political mileage specially just before election time. During October and November 2018 Panchayat election was happening on phase manner and for different post therefore almost two months project work was at halt and therefore we were behind our schedule plan for few months but make up the loss of time with our speed Infrastructure Development.

As mentioned earlier that SANSAD is having a two Acres plot and we have built a small cow sheds for animals with the support of RKK and at present 3 Cows and 2 Buffalos with their calf's are leaving there. SANSAD has also put up a Bio gas plant on the same farm land which produces sufficient organic manure for our land as well as produces cooking gas for 6-8 people and lighting 3-4 lamps. This piece of land is used for demonstrating various types of cultivation in different cropping seasons. So far we have demonstrated rice cultivation through SRI methods, Wheat cultivation as mixed crop and seasonal vegetables plantation to the farmers of the area on this demonstration plot of SANSAD.
